

# Give HIM the produce at the proper time!

Why do Catholic Churches have altars?  
Why are Catholic ministers called “priests”?

Priests offer a sacrifice on an altar. Recall hearing this at every Mass... “my brothers and sisters, please pray that this—my sacrifice and yours—be found acceptable by God, the almighty Father”.

Jesus Christ is NOT re-sacrificed; we offer a “sacramental re-presentation” of His “once for all” sacrifice. Jesus, our High Priest, offered the perfect sacrifice on the altar of the cross for the sake of our redemption. He is NOT re-sacrificed; as we do what He has taught us when He said “Do this in memory of me.” He is God and, at the priest’s obedient uttering, “This IS my Body” and “This IS my Blood” the Lord comes to us under the veil of bread and wine.

This is the perfect sacrifice that all others offered in Old Testament days point to!

But, what about our prayer that “this—my sacrifice and yours—be found acceptable by God, the almighty Father”? As priest I offer Our Lord’s “one, eternal, perfect” sacrifice, at His instruction, after proclaiming “we do well always and everywhere to give Him, thanks and praise”.

“Through Him then, let us continually offer up a sacrifice of praise to God, that is, the fruit of lips that give thanks to His name.” (Heb 13:5)

“For I delight in loyalty rather than sacrifice, And in the knowledge of God rather than burnt offerings.” (Hosea 6:6)

“Go and find out what this means: ‘I desire mercy not sacrifice’. (Matthew 9:13)

Every good gift can be traced back to the Lord our God! As Stewards of what has been entrusted to our care we are to give back a portion to express our loyalty and gratitude to our Lord and our God whose perfect sacrifice is the Greatest Gift we will ever know.

Tithes/offerings are a part of every believer’s life. Give joyfully, give thankfully, excel in the grace of giving; never feel pressured to give.

Giving is about the joy in your heart as you give! If you haven’t already discovered the joy of giving out of a felt sense of gratitude.
