

“THE OUR FATHER”

This prayer contains 7 petitions...

1. **Hallowed be thy Name**—may your name be treated as holy and sacred.

2. **Thy Kingdom come**—domain ruled by God, my king. Jesus is exact representation of God; we created free to be loved and to love all. Fallen world choose cross and love: my domain or God's?

3. **Thy will be done**—There are only two kinds of people in the end: those who say to God, "Thy will be done," and those to whom God says, in the end, "Thy will be done." All that are in Hell, choose it. Without that self-choice there could be no Hell. No soul that seriously and constantly desires joy will ever miss it. Those who seek find. Those who knock it is opened. (C.S. Lewis)

4. **Give us this day our daily bread**—understood it as comprehending that daily supply of grace which the soul requires to keep it in health and vigour: He who uses the petition would do well to keep both in view. Observe 1. God is the author and dispenser of all temporal as well as spiritual good. 2. We have merited no kind of good from his hand, and therefore must receive it as a free gift: Give us, daily for support; we are not permitted to ask any thing for to-morrow: give us today.

5. **Forgive us our trespasses**—Our sins are our debts; there is a trespass of duty, which, as creatures, we owe to our Creator; we do not pray to be discharged from that, but upon the non-payment of that debt there arises a punishment; due to our failure of obedience to the will of God we ask for mercy and forgiveness. We claim to recognize we are to forgive others debts as we are petitioning forgiveness for our own.

6. **And lead us not into temptation**—The sixth request is not to be in a place where temptation might overwhelm us. It is not wrong to be tempted or tested (Jesus was!). It is wrong to give in to this temptation.

7. **Deliver us from evil** When Jesus was tempted by Satan, he declared: *Man shall not live on bread alone, but on every word that comes from the mouth of God.* In times of trial, Jesus recognizes the Lord as His source of deliverance. Likewise we are to depend on God when evil is at our door.

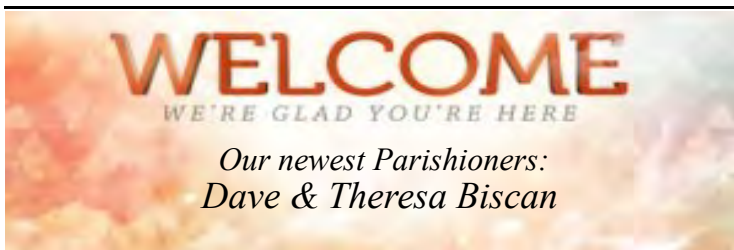
YOUTH MINISTRY NEWS

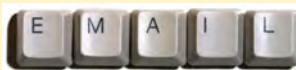
