"My thoughts are not your thoughts, neither are your ways my ways" Is 55:8

In this Gospel (Mat 20:1-16a), too, we hear of the God who is very different from how we might think.

This parable of the Kingdom is upsetting for most 21st century Americans. It's about paychecks. And it strikes many as unfair. God's thoughts are not our thoughts, that's true. But from our way of looking at things it doesn't seem right that a person doing the same work for 12 hrs. gets paid the same as the person who worked for 1 hr.

Doesn't seem fair, does it? Well, it was fair in the sense that the landowner kept his word. The workers who put in 12 hours did get paid exactly what they agreed to work for. Hmm, Jesus knows us well. Very well. He knew how people would react and, he—I believe-- wants us to be honest with our self and our response.

Jesus teaches his disciples not to claim any special honor or any special place because they are closely associated with him or because they are the first members of his Church. All the people, no matter when they come, are equally precious to God. Similarly, long-time Church members should expect no special preference over recent members. Through this parable, Jesus describes the loving concern, generosity and mercy of God his Father for all His children, which is clearly seen in the life of Jesus.

Jesus knew that our work for the kingdom day after day until the day our lives on earth end -that's quitting time-- would cause us to wonder about our heavenly paycheck. That's how people think. What's in it for me? God; Father, Son and Holy Spirit, has promised us eternal life. That is to be "our pay" for work in His vineyard. The daily wage a day laborer received in ancient days (and today, too) was a subsistence wage, enough to survive. That is to be our pay: we will survive death; we will be given eternal life.




CHILDREN'S LITURGY OF THE WORD




