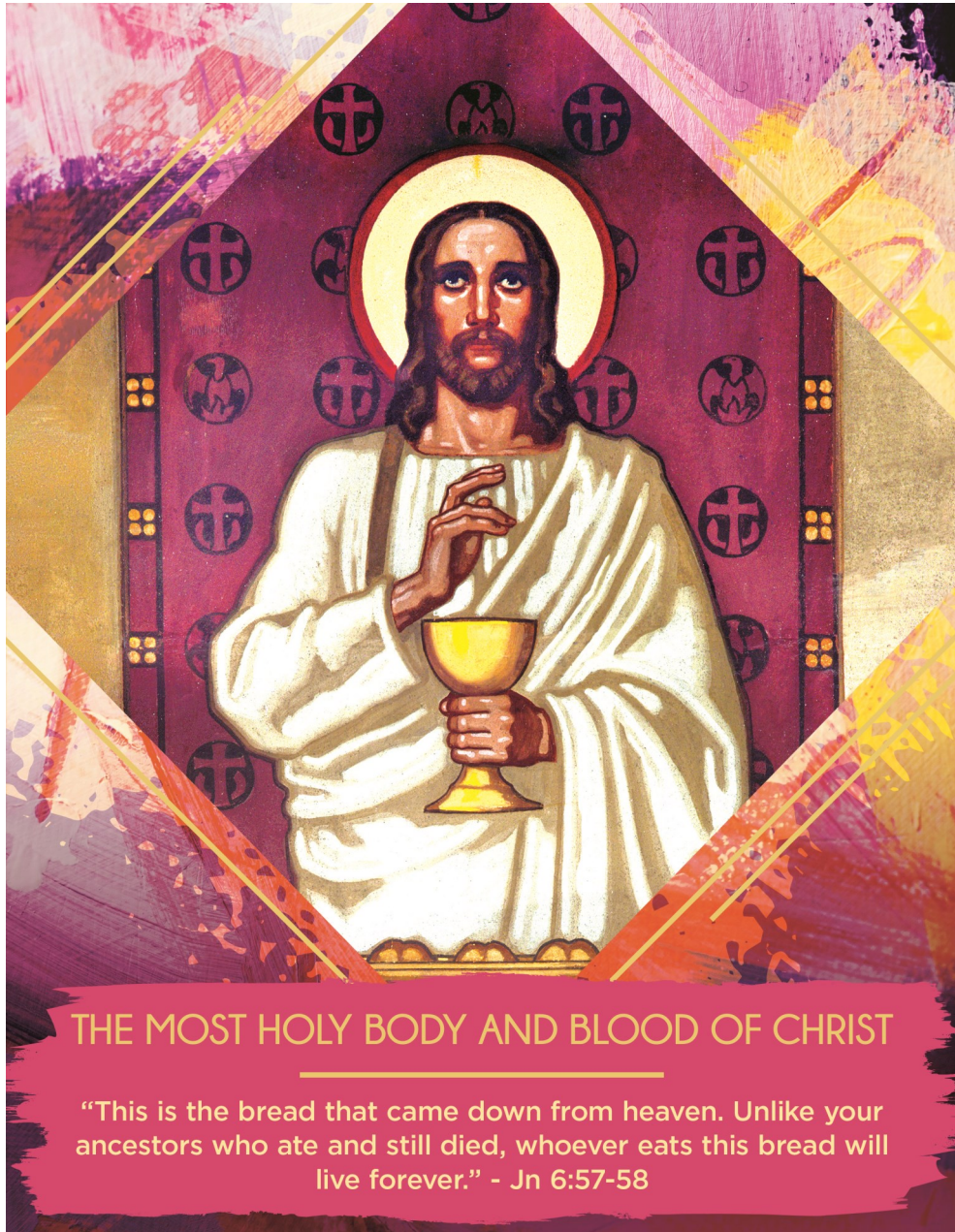

Greetings and welcome to St. Cecelia's Corner. For your information, St. Cecelia is the patron of music and of course, she is my patron and guardian in all things I do. Her feast day is Nov. 22, so of course I celebrate her feast day with great fanfare.

First of all, thank you for the warm welcome. It was lovely to visit with so many of you and I apologize for not remembering all of your names. Give me time and I will get there. I love to know all the people that I work with and pray with also.

In this column I will try to share with you as much as possible about the liturgy and also the music that is experienced at St. Annas. I am not only a musician who makes music in the church, but also a lover and historian of the Roman liturgy. There is a wonderful Latin saying "lex orandi, lex credendi", which means the way we pray is what we believe. In other words, the words we sing, pray and contemplate at Mass are what we really believe. Thus, it places a great responsibility on those of us who lead at Mass to be aware of what we say and do.

Lastly, we do not sing at Mass. But we SING THE MASS. The Roman rite is designed to be sung, from start to finish. Everyone has their part, from priest to choir to people. The question is not just about songs, which are somewhat incidental, but to those things which Holy Mother Church gives us to sing. We'll talk more about that later.
