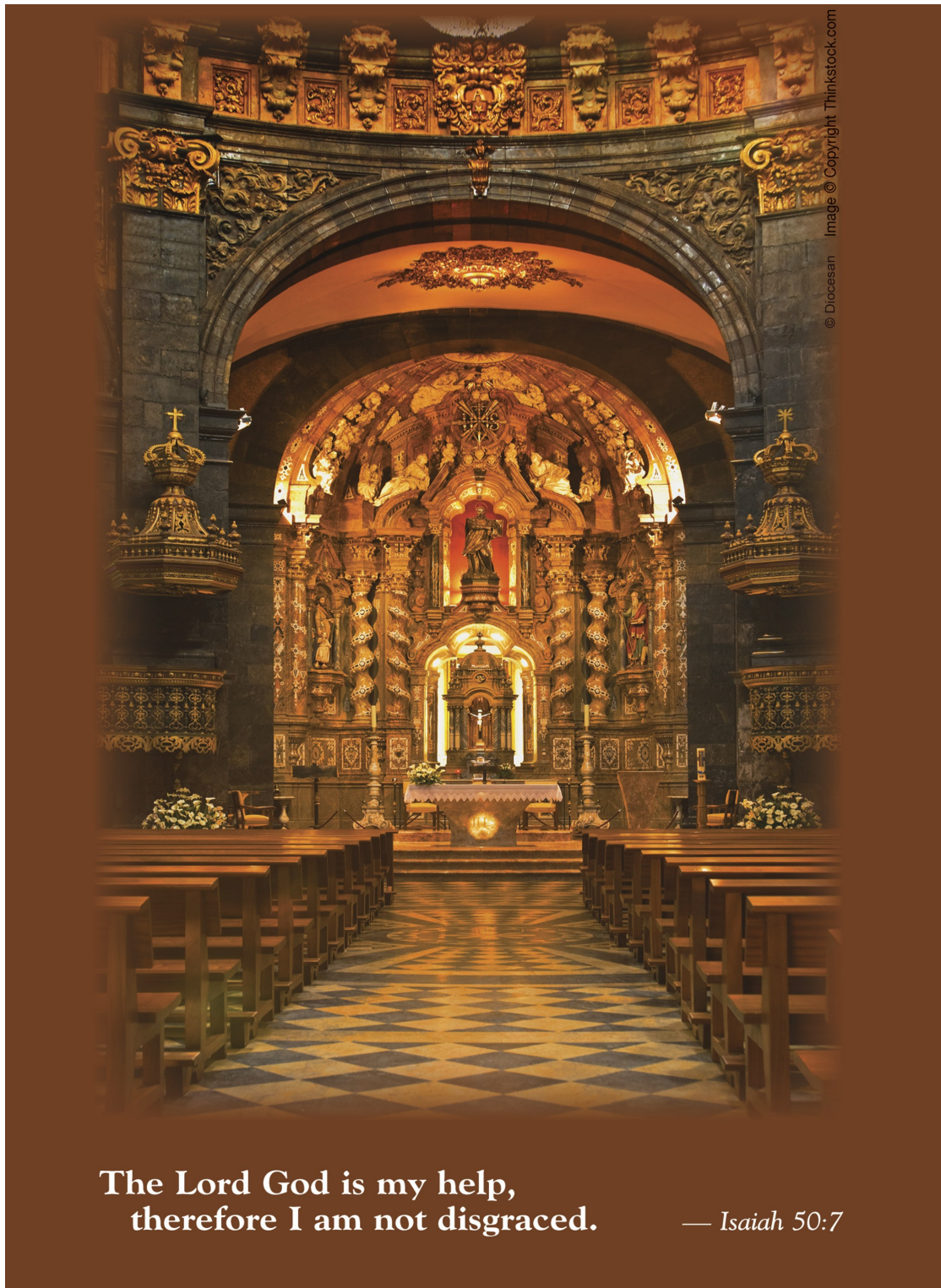

FEAST DAYS, SOLEMNITIES AND MEMORIALS

We have three cycles of days in the Church. Most people are familiar with the cycle of readings, which is a three-year cycle. Right now, we are finishing year B and at Advent we will begin cycle C. As such a Sunday has two names, the liturgical name of the Sunday and its year. For instance, this Sunday that I am writing for is the 24th Sunday in Ordinary Time, Cycle B. A mouthful to say the least. But there are two other cycles to consider. The cycle of propers (Introit, Offertory and Communion chants) is a one-year cycle. That one-year cycle is very old and represents the ancient cycle of the Mass very closely. Sometimes it is so old that it can make no sense. Only through careful piecing can the chants make any sense in the context. And sometimes the editors during the development of the Novus Ordo cut things so as not to make any sense. We have lost some wonderful things because of these editors. But that is another story. Then the last cycle to consider is the sanctoral cycle, that is the cycle of Saint's days, celebrations to remember someone and or a place. The sanctoral cycle is set by the saint's day, which is the day that they were "born" into heaven (We call it their "dies natalis" in Latin). And within the cycle there are feasts, solemnities and memorials. Feasts and their higher counterpart, the solemnity, generally celebrate a saint or an important liturgical day. Memorials remember someone. There is a hierarchy for solemnities. Some are more important than others. But that is for another article. Needless to say, keeping up with all these cycles can be challenging. But for me, it has become a way of life. I measure time by liturgical days and remember days by their saint recognition. For instance, Sept. 8 is the nativity of Mary, and the feast of Our Mother of Sorrows is Sept. 15. St. Michael and the Holy angels is Sept. 29. October 7 is Our Lady of the Rosary. There! Now I have named just a few days for you. Want to know more? Buy an ordo or prayer book.

If you become aware of or have a reasonable suspicion of abuse you are required to report within 24 hours by Georgia law.

Reports of child abuse and neglect can be made by phone to 1-855-GA CHILD (1-855-422-4453) 24 hours/day, 7 days/week.

Archdiocesan policy requires a follow up letter to be sent to your local DFCS office detailing all the information provided to the intake center in order to keep records of our response to allegations of abuse. A copy of the letter also needs to be sent to the Office of Child and Youth Protection.

If an allegation of abuse involves any member of the clergy, employee, or volunteer of the Archdiocese of Atlanta, you must contact the Office of the District Attorney and the Office of Child and Youth Protection in addition to DFCS within 24 hours.
