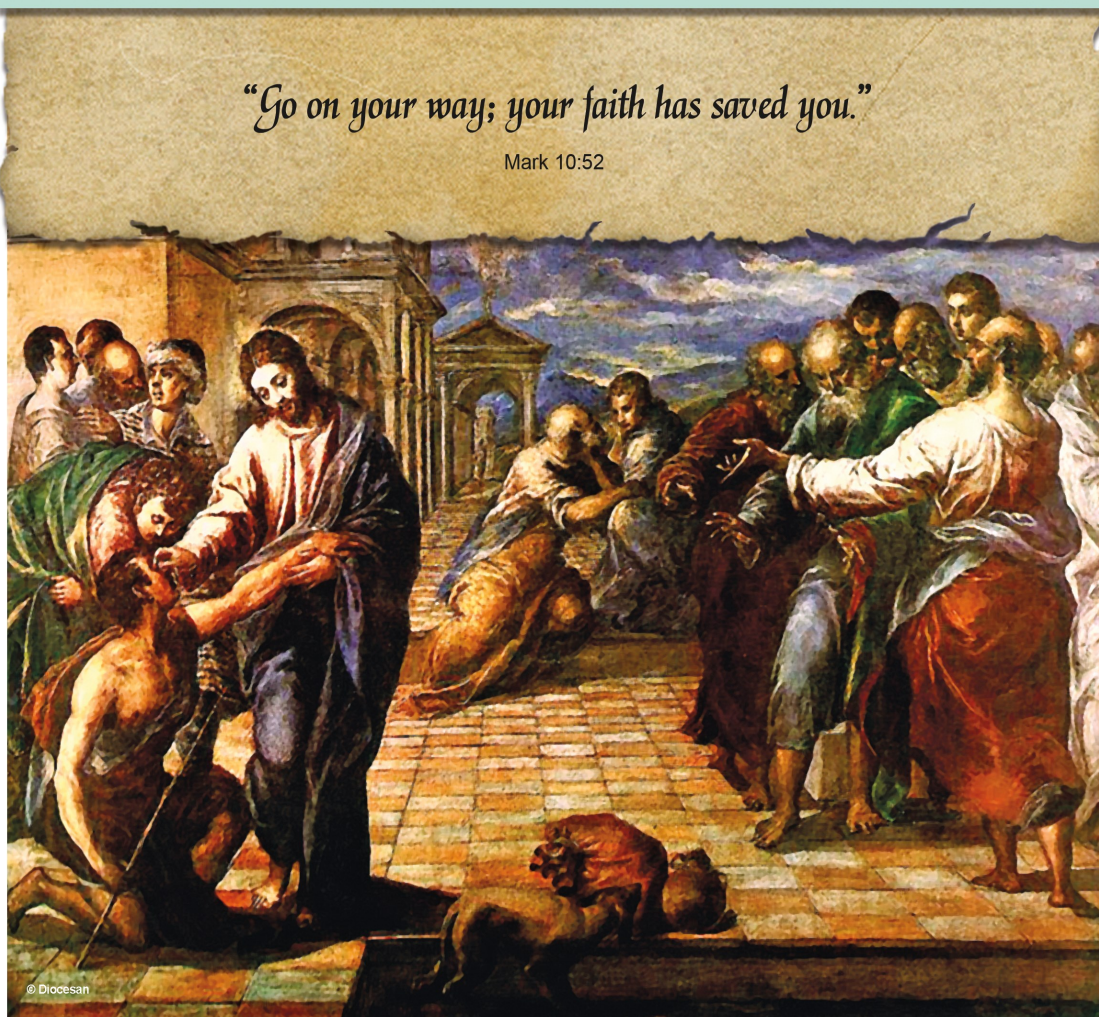

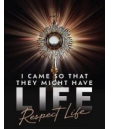

THE IMMINENT ARRIVAL OF THE ORGAN

The organ shall arrive sometime between late November and Christmas. In preparation for its arrival, here are some fun facts to know about it. The organ will contain about 750 pipes. The size of the pipe ranges from a pipe some 12 feet long to a pipe smaller than a pencil. The organ is fully mechanical except for one item: the blower, which supplies air to the organ. The organ is played by the oldest form of organ action called "tracker" action. This action mechanism was designed in the 1500s and is still used for modern organs. The organ will have three keyboards: two for the hands of 61 notes and one for the feet of 32 notes. If you look where the piano is, you will see blue tape on the floor. That blue tape is the footprint of the organ. It is very compact. It will take about two weeks for the organ to be put together here. The builder will disassemble it and ship it. Then he will put it together here at the church. The organ is a combination of old pipes (some more than 100 years old) and new pipes. Watch for more organ facts.

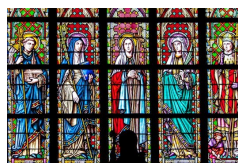

If you become aware of or have a reasonable suspicion of abuse you are required to report within 24 hours by Georgia law.

Reports of child abuse and neglect can be made by phone to 1-855-GA CHILD (1-855-422-4453) 24 hours/day, 7 days/week.

Archdiocesan policy **requires** a **follow up letter** to be sent to your local DFCS office detailing all the information provided to the intake center in order to keep records of our response to allegations of abuse. A copy of the letter also needs

to be sent to the **Office of Child and Youth Protection**. If an allegation of abuse involves any member of the clergy,

employee, or volunteer of the Archdiocese of Atlanta, you must contact the Office of the District Attorney and the Office of

Child and Youth Protection in addition to DFCS within 24 hours.
